CarsonAllaria Wealth Management, LTD., is registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) as an investment adviser. WHAT INVESTMENT SERVICES AND ADVICE CAN YOU PROVIDE ME?

Our Firm offers investment advisory services to retail investors. Our firm manages advisory accounts on a discretionary basis. In a discretionary account, you have granted written investment authority to your Financial Professional to execute purchase and sell orders in your advisory accounts without consulting with you first. You may limit our discretion, such as by imposing reasonable restrictions on investing in certain securities or groups of securities. Our Firm monitors your investment advisory accounts, and specific investments within your accounts, on an ongoing basis to align with your investment goals. This service is included as part of the Firm's standard advisory services. We do not impose a minimum account size for opening an account with our Firm. For certain accounts, our Firm will recommend utilizing sub-advisor to implement part or in whole the investment strategies of a client's portfolio. In addition, our Firm offers financial planning and consulting services for our clients. Financial Planning services can be provided on a stand-alone basis or in conjunction with our investment management services. Our Firm provides general investment recommendations, on a limited basis to our clients. In a consulting engagement, you will be required to select your own investment managers, custodian, and/or insurance companies for the implementation of consulting recommendations.

ITEM 3 – FEES, COSTS, CONFLICTS, AND STANDARD OF CONDUCT

WHAT FEES WILL I PAY?

Our Firm receives a fee as compensation for providing investment advisory services on your account. The investment management fee includes investment management supervision, trade entry, and other account maintenance and/or service activities. Our investment management fees are based on a percentage of the total account value. Our maximum annual investment advisory fee is 1.25%, billed in advance on a quarterly basis. The Firm does impose a minimum annual advisory fee of \$1,725 for accounts under \$150,000. You pay this fee even if you don't buy or sell investments. The more assets in your advisory account, the more you will pay in fees, and therefore, our Firm has an incentive to encourage you to increase the asset value in your account. The custodian will charge transaction costs, custodial fees, redemption fees, retirement plan and administrative fees, or commissions. The mutual funds and/or ETFs held in your advisory account(s) will charge management fees and other expenses. Our other Firm fees are billed as follows: Fees for financial planning services are included in the investment management fee above. For standalone plans, fees will not exceed \$3,000 for the first year in which a comprehensive financial plan is delivered. Fees for consulting services are negotiated on an hourly or fixed dollar amount. For wrap fee program accounts, you will pay us a single asset-based fee for advisory services. This fee also covers most transaction costs and certain administrative and custodial costs associated with your investments. If you expect to trade infrequently or to pursue a "buy and hold" strategy, a wrap fee program may cost you more than paying for the program's services separately. You will pay fees and costs whether you make or lose money on your investments. Fees and costs will reduce the amount of money you make on your investments over time. Please make sure you understand what fees and costs you are paying.

**WHAT ARE YOUR LEGAL OBLIGATIONS TO ME WHEN ACTING AS MY INVESTMENT ADVISER?
HOW ELSE DOES YOUR FIRM MAKE MONEY AND WHAT CONFLICTS OF INTEREST DO YOU HAVE?**

When we act as your investment adviser, we have to act in your best interest and not put our interest ahead of yours. At the same time, the way we make money creates some conflicts with your interests. You should understand and ask us about these conflicts because they affect the investment advice we provide you. Here are some examples to help you understand what this means. 1) Asset-based fees present a conflict because our Firm is incentivized by encouraging you to invest additional funds in your advisory accounts. Asset-based fee compensation also poses a conflict when for example, advising you to rollover a 401(k) balance, when equivalent and less costly options are available if funds are left with the employer's fund manager. Other conflicts to consider are: 2) Some of our firm's financial professionals are registered representatives of an unaffiliated broker-dealer, and they may offer you brokerage services through the unaffiliated broker-dealer or advisory services through our firm. Registered representatives charge a transaction-based commission each time they buy or sell a security in a brokerage account. As a result, they have an incentive to trade as much as possible in order to increase their compensation. 3) Our Firm utilizes solicitors and pays compensation to independent third parties for the referral of clients to our Firm. 4) Our Firm allows our Financial Professionals to trade in their personal accounts and may invest in the same securities as clients. However, all our Financial Professionals personal securities accounts are supervised on an ongoing basis. 5) Lastly, some of the products, services and other benefits provided by your custodians are used in servicing all of our Firm's advisory accounts and therefore may not directly benefit your advisory account. If you have questions about whether any of these situations could apply to your investments, ask your Financial Professional.

HOW DO YOUR FINANCIAL PROFESSIONALS MAKE MONEY?

Our financial professionals are compensated based on the revenue our firm earns from our investment advisory fees. This compensation is based on the amount of assets they service, the amount of time spent, and the complexity required to meet the client's needs or revenue based on the recommendations provided by our Financial Professionals. Some of our Financial Professionals are insurance licensed and receive commissions, trails, or other compensation from the respective insurance companies as a result of effecting insurance transactions. However, you have the right to decide whether to act on the recommendation. We recognize our duty to place your interests first and have established policies in this regard to avoid any conflicts of interest. When our Financial Professionals act as a registered representative of a broker-dealer, our Financial Professionals receive commissions in connection with the transactions made in your account. While some of our Firm's Financial Professionals are engaged in outside business activities, we are required to disclose material outside business activities and any conflict it may pose to you. Our Firm supervises the business activities of our Financial Professionals through our compliance program. All Financial Professionals are required to follow a Code of Conduct to mitigate any conflicts to you.
